# COVID-19

- Today, 24 patients were tested for COVID-19 at one of Concord Hospital Medical Group's two dedicated COVID-19 screening/testing sites and nine of those patients were further evaluated by a provider.
- Concord Hospital Medical Group practices have suspended regular office visits and instead are conducting telemedicine phone visits. As of March 23, 2020, 1,376 telephone visits have been completed and an additional 1,358 scheduled.
- As of March 24, 2020, the Concord Hospital health system has ordered COVID-19 tests for approximately 383 patients. To date, the Hospital has received results for 173 patients, which includes four COVID-19 positive results.
- Of the four positive results, one patient is currently hospitalized at Concord Hospital and three are recovering at home.
- Concord Hospital Facilities has been working to convert regular patient rooms into negative pressure isolation rooms for COVID-19 patients. Negative pressure isolation rooms are used to contain airborne contaminants within a room and prevent the contaminants from drifting to other areas of the Hospital. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Hospital had 21 negative pressure isolation rooms. Today, the Hospital has 75 such rooms.
